Dr. Anthony Everett (he, him, ours) is a public theologian, social entrepreneur, and prophetic activist. He serves as the Siloam Project Coordinator for Baptist Seminary of Kentucky. Also, Dr. Everett serves as the founding president of The Centre for Prophetic Activism, a social justice enterprise, and CEO of Alpha Management LLC, a consulting firm.

In high school, he learned about the atrocity of Apartheid;

inspired, Dr. Everett joined the anti-apartheid movement. As a student activist at Howard University, he joined the movement for the liberation of Zimbabwe. He transitioned to the corporate world to work for EDS Corporation (now HP Enterprises) and completed his undergraduate studies with a Bachelor of Science degree in organizational management at Paul Quinn College. As an executive at EDS, Dr. Everett led teams across ethnic, racial, nationality, and cultural lines to create more diverse, inclusive, and equitable environments for co-workers. He led the implementation of the School of Adaptive Computer Training (Atlanta, GA) for the physically challenged – a joint EDS and Cerebral Palsy Research Foundation collaboration – and raised over \$1.25M for the project.

Dr. Everett completed the Master of Divinity program with Urban Ministry Certification at Perkins School of Theology at Southern Methodist University. He also completed the Doctor of Ministry degree at United Theological Seminary. Dr. Everett is an elder with the United Methodist Church (UMC), having served as the associate director for African American Ministries with New Church Development for the Kentucky Conference. He planted Nia Community of Faith in Lexington, Kentucky and led Wesley UMC (Lexington) and University Circle UMC, a multi-racial congregation in Cleveland, Ohio. Dr. Everett is a coach/consultant with the Strengthening the Black Church for the 21st Century (SBC21) Coaching Network.

A 2010 graduate of Leadership Lexington and Leadership Kentucky and former Vice Chair of the Kentucky Commission on Human Rights, Dr. Everett is an advocate for Black, Indigenous, and People of Color (BIPOC) communities. He is a member of the Faith Leaders of Color Coalition (a national ecumenical coalition to end the death penalty), the Equity Council of the Fayette County Public

Schools, the Program Board of CivicLex, and the advisory board of B.L.A.C.K. (Black Leadership Action Coalition of Kentucky) as well as a life member of Alpha Phi Alpha Fraternity, Inc.

Born in Washington, D.C., Dr. Everett is married to American Spiritual Ensemble soprano soloist, Dr. Angelique Clay Everett, an associate professor at the University of Kentucky School of Music and native of Louisville, Kentucky. The Everetts are an empty nest, blended family with four adult children and two grandchildren.
